- Venue: Chautauqua Yacht Club

- Rules: The races will be governed by the rules defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- Eligibility: The regatta is open to Class C-Scows. **Helms-persons MUST be Regular Members and the 1<sup>st</sup> crew MUST be at least an Associate Member of the NCSSA.** 3rds are not required to be members, but are encouraged to be at least Associate Members. Eligible yachts may be entered by completing the registration form and sending it to the Chautauqua Yacht Club, PO Box 1122, Chautauqua, NY 14722.
- Advertising: The regatta is designated as a Category A event in accordance with the ISAF Regulation 20.
- Registration: The entry fee is \$85 until May 26, 2010  
The entry fee is \$105 from May 27<sup>th</sup> until the close of registration.
- For skippers under the age of 25 years (as of June 15, 2010),**  
The entry fee is \$40 until May 26, 2010.  
The entry fee is \$50 from May 27<sup>th</sup> until the close of registration.

The meal package fee is \$75 per person, and includes breakfast Friday, Saturday and Sunday, lunch buffet on shore Friday, Saturday and Sunday a box lunch, also dinner Friday and Saturday.

Scoring: The low point scoring system, RRS A4, shall apply. Six races are scheduled, of which three must be completed to constitute a series. A boat's worst score will be discarded if all six races are completed.  
This changes RRS A2.

Prizes: NCSSA perpetual trophies will be awarded as per the class requirements.  
Series prizes will be awarded to skipper and two crew finishing 1 through 10.
